2026 IT'S 5 O'CLOCK SOMEWHERE

Event Details

"It's 5 O'Clock Somewhere" is an NSSA-registered event that any NSSA member club may offer to its members during the 2026 shooting year. There will be a total of four (4) "5 O'Clock Somewhere" events offered throughout the year. Each event will be conducted over a five (5) week period.

Each event will be shot using a designated gauge for each week. For the first "5 O'Clock Somewhere" event, the first four (4) weeks will be **12G**, with **Doubles** shot during the fifth and final week. For the remaining three (3) events, the designated weekly events will be **12G, 20G, 28G, .410B, and Doubles**. Each shooting week will begin on Monday and conclude on Sunday.

Each weekly shooting week will be registered as a 50-target event. When combined, this results in a 200-target HOA and a 250-target HAA for the full event. All "5 O'Clock Somewhere" events are Honors Only, and registered targets shot during these events are eligible for All-American and Class All-American points.

The event schedule below outlines each event along with the corresponding weekly shooting schedule.

Squadding and Scoring

Shooters may participate at any time during their club's normal operating hours and must shoot the gauge designated for that week. A minimum of three (3) shooters is required per squad; however, all three shooters are not required to participate in the "5 O'Clock Somewhere" event. If non-participating shooters are used to fill a squad, their names must be clearly written on the scorecard. Shooters may pull and score their own targets, or clubs and shooters may compensate pullers, scorers, or referees for pulling and scoring targets.

Shoot-Offs

Shoot-offs are optional. If a shooter chooses to participate in a shoot-off, they will shoot **one full box of 3-4-5 Doubles**, which will be recorded as the shoot-off long-run for the **designated gauge**. Shooters are responsible for paying the club for all shoot-off rounds.

For shooters who do not participate in a shoot-off, the **designated gauge's long-runs** will be used to break ties. If a tie still exists after comparing long-runs, **coin flips** will be used to determine placement.

All shoot-offs must be completed during the designated shooting week for that event and may not be completed at any other time.

Make-Up Week

Make-up weeks are permitted to allow shooters an opportunity to complete a designated gauge if they are unable to shoot during the originally scheduled week. A shooter may make up a missed gauge **only during the immediately following week**.

If a shooter misses a designated gauge, the makeup score must be shot during the **immediately following week**. For example, a missed **12G** week may be made up during the **20G** week, and a missed **20G** week may be made up during the **28G** week. Makeup scores may not be carried forward beyond the next scheduled shooting week.

Clubs **must notify NSSA in advance** when a shooter will need to make up a designated gauge. This notification may be due to circumstances such as a club closure, a shooter being out of town, illness, or similar situations. Advance notification allows NSSA to properly track and accept the makeup scores. If NSSA is **not notified in advance** that a shooter will be making up a missed gauge, the shooter's makeup scores **will not be accepted**.

Shooter Classification

Results **WILL NOT** be posted to a shooter's history until all five (5) weeks of that "5 O'Clock Somewhere" event have been completed. Shooters **may not record averages until the entire five (5) week event is complete**, even if some weeks have already been shot.





Cost

Shooters will pay their club the normal rate charged for practice, plus NSSA fees (\$0.04 per target) and appropriate State Association fees. Clubs should verify State target fees with their respective State Association.

Once the five (5) week “5 O’Clock Somewhere” event is complete, all NSSA and State Association fees must be submitted by the club. NSSA fees may be paid electronically by Credit Card through the [NSSA Shoot Payment Form](#) or by sending a check directly to NSSA Headquarters. **When submitting payment online, clubs must remove the NSC Club Information and replace it with their own club information so the payment can be properly identified and credited.**

Submitting Scores, Skeet Manager & iSkeet Video's, and Help

All participating clubs are required to use **NSSA Skeet Manager (NSM)** and **iSkeet functionality** to sync scores with **iSkeet.org** for tracking by NSSA Shoot Management.

 - If assistance is needed with login credentials, clubs should contact NSSA at **210-688-3371, ext. 962**. Clubs that already have NSSA Skeet Manager installed must use the **Help → Check for Version Updates** feature within NSM and update to **version 26.01 or later**.
