It is a great privilege for Cross Creek Skeet Association to host the 2019 Junior World Skeet Championship 25-28 July, at the Fort Bragg Clay Target Center.

Fort Bragg Clay Target Center is located at 651 East Manchester Road, in the town of Spring Lake, in the Sandhills Region of North Carolina. It is NOT PHYSICALLY LOCATED ON Fort Bragg Military Installation. The Center is about 2 miles from a variety of hotels and nationally known restaurants in Spring Lake. Additional hotels, restaurants, and a shopping mall are about 12 miles away in Fayetteville. A separate list of local hotels and prices will be available on the NSSA website.

The Center is about 20 miles from the Fayetteville Regional Airport and about 70 miles from Raleigh-Durham International Airport. Both airports have rental cars available.

The Clay Target Center has 12 regulation skeet ranges, a club house, 28 grassy RV sites with electric (50/30 Amp) and water, and 10 grassy RV sites with electric only (50/30 Amp). There is a dump station on-site. In addition, there is a large bathhouse with showers and a laundry room.

Registration is by MAIL ONLY. No postmarks prior to 1 April 2019. A \$50 deposit per shooter is required—check only. The Cross Creek Skeet Association does not accept credit cards. Therefore, please be prepared to pay shoot fees by cash or check. Requests for RV sites should be noted on the registration form, which is available on the NSSA website. On-site registration opens Wednesday, 25 July at noon and will remain open until 5pm. Registration will be open 8am to 5pm daily Thursday through Saturday.

The Fort Bragg Clay Target Center pro shop will accept credit cards for camping fees, practice rounds, and purchase of ammunition, snacks, and other items.

There will be an opening ceremony Friday morning 26 July, prior to the start of the competition for the day. We hope many of you will plan to attend, as we hope to have participation of an Army Parachute team—based on their availability and weather the day of the event. This was a main highlight during the 2014 Junior World.

The Sandhills of North Carolina has plenty to offer each family that comes to visit. The military history of Fort Bragg, the Airborne-Special Operations Museum, revitalized downtown Fayetteville, local towns with numerous antique shops, nearby world class golf courses, and so much more, make this a very special place. In addition, North Carolina beaches are only 2 hours away, and the North Carolina Mountains are about a 4 hour drive.
