New Business

1. NSSA Shoot updates

<u>World Shoot Preparations and Current Registration:</u> President Naler received a few inquiries regarding the Hall of Fame banquet, and we are moving forward with hosting at the Courtyard Marriott. We have 276 shooters pre-registered for the Mini, and 320 for the Main.

<u>U.S. Open</u>: We have 798 shooters pre-registered.

Masters: We have 208 shooters pre-registered.

Junior World: Registration opens April 1st.

<u>Triple J Classic</u>: Very successful event; had 276 total shooters and 250 4-gun shooters. The redemption rate for the \$20 BJs certificates was 52%, and one of the main sponsors commented that numerous shooters personally thanked him for his support. Overall, have received very positive feedback on the shoot and referees.

Nathan Boyd noted that the trend this year has been for shooters to sign up later rather than sooner.

2. Headquarters

<u>LOC</u> (line of credit): Balance of \$100,224.62 has been **paid off**. We can always draw, if necessary, up to our approved \$3M limit. Hitting accounts receivables hard; 39% of receivables are 30+ days

<u>Protech Update</u>: End of June is target for being ready to go live. We will need to utilize Protech's "in house" reporting environment v an outside source as hoped. NSCA change implementing sub-gauges will result in additional \$14K programming cost. <u>IT Department New Hire</u>: Position description is posted to Indeed website and we will post to Target Talk to inquire within our members and their friends and family.

NSC: Hodgen/Spolar is moving out of their vendor space. We have someone ready to take this space; continue to engage ammunition manufacturers to ensure availability for our events.
